






Ogle County Drop-Off Recycling Instructions

October 2007

Please follow these instructions! If in doubt, leave it out. Place any acceptable item in any bin.

If one bin is full, please deposit items in another bin (YES, it is OK to mix items). They will be sorted at the recycling facility.

ITEMS TO BE RECYCLED	YES!	NO!
<p>NEWSPAPERS</p> 	<p><u>Clean</u> newspapers, all ads & inserts</p>	<p>Bags or string, wet, moldy or dirty newspapers.</p>
<p>OTHER PAPER</p> 	<p>Magazines, junk mail, catalogs, phone books, office paper, flattened chipboard (cereal & pasta boxes), paper grocery bags, shoe boxes, <u>flattened</u> corrugated cardboard, beer/soda boxes, paper milk and juice cartons, post-it-notes, tissue boxes, books, gift wrap, pizza boxes, construction paper, yellow cardboard</p>	<p>Tissues, napkins, waxed paper or waxed cardboard, fast-food wrap, plastic lined paper dog or cat food bags, or wood.</p>
<p>PLASTIC CONTAINERS</p> 	<p><u>Marked #1-#7 on bottom</u>, empty soft drink, milk, laundry, bleach jugs, shampoo & household cleaner bottles, yogurt containers, peanut butter containers, cottage cheese containers, margarine tubs, anti-freeze or motor oil containers, etc. Remove and recycle all lids. Flatten bottles & jugs if possible to save space.</p>	<p><u>Containers with no #'s on bottom</u>, Styrofoam (cups, peanuts, rigid packing materials, etc.), toys, plastic bags, plastic silverware, hangers, buckets, laundry baskets, items that contained hazardous materials.</p>
<p>ALUMINUM & STEEL</p> 	<p>Empty aluminum & steel food & beverage cans & lids, aluminum foil & pie plates, baking pans & tins, paint cans that have no paint residue, empty aerosol cans.</p>	<p>Scrap metal, cleaning fluid & poison containers, wires, hangers, toys, silverware, containers from petroleum based household solvents & pesticides, paint cans with liquid or dry paint residue, aerosol cans with some product remaining.</p>
<p>GLASS</p> 	<p>Glass food & beverage containers - clear, green, brown bottles & jars.</p>	<p>All other glass including window glass, light bulbs, mirrors, Pyrex, ceramic, porcelain, drinking glasses, dishes, tableware, broken glass.</p>

NO DUMPING OF REFUSE, LANDSCAPE WASTE, HAZARDOUS WASTE, TIRES, APPLIANCES, TOYS, CLOTHING, OR OTHER WASTE!

OGLE COUNTY RECYCLING STATION LOCATIONS

1. **Forreston** South Ash Street, $\frac{1}{2}$ block south of Main Street (IL Rt. 72), two blocks east of IL Rt. 26 (near City Public Works Dept.).
2. **Monroe Center** Mulford Road and the railroad crossing, north side. Take IL Rt. 72 to Mulford Rd., go south $3\frac{1}{2}$ blocks, turn west along RR.
3. **Oregon** Ogle County Farm Bureau parking lot (421 W. Pines Road). Take IL Rt. 2 to Pines Road, turn west, go about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, on south side.
4. **Rochelle** Wal-Mart parking lot (1240 N. 7th Street). IL Rt. 251, about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north of IL. Rt. 38, on west side of street.
5. **Byron** Byron Forest Preserve. River Road entrance near maintenance buildings. Open day-light hours only.
6. **Orchard Hills*** Located at the Veolia Orchard Hills Landfill, 8290 Highway 251, Davis Junction, Illinois. Stop at scale house.
7. **Polo**** Located at the corner of Franklin and Locust Streets, north of Olsen's Grain Elevator.
8. **Hillcrest***** Located behind the Village Hall, 204 Hillcrest Avenue.

*The Orchard Hills Recycling Station is provided by Veolia Orchard Hills Landfill, Inc.

**The Polo Recycling Station is provided by Moring Disposal, Inc.

***The Hillcrest Recycling Station is provided by the Village of Hillcrest for Hillcrest residents.



IS RECYCLING ENOUGH?

We must now take the next step! Recycling materials instead of landfilling them is only half the job. In order to complete the recycling cycle we must also buy recycled products. By helping create a market for recycled products, we ensure that recycling works! A package label will usually identify whether the product or packaging material is made of recycled materials. Read the labels and please buy recycled content products!

Abuse it, then you could lose it!

Garbage and other nonrecyclable items placed in the recycling stations jeopardizes the program. Frequent contamination could cause loads to end up in a landfill or the recycling station could be removed.

Please do not leave items on the deck.



Do you have old tires, computers/electronic equipment or household hazardous waste to get rid of?

Each year Ogle & Lee County solid waste departments try to schedule special collection events to recycle or safely dispose of materials which are difficult to get rid of. Please contact our office or visit our website for recycling options and more information.

Five of the recycling stations are provided for you by the Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department. They are intended for the use of Ogle County residents who either do not have recycling service available in their area or wish to recycle a wider variety of materials than is accepted by the curbside recycling service.
